Exciting New Project at Hale House

Hale House is very excited to announce a new project for our garden area on Marlborough Street. Hale House will be expanding the small seating area in the upper garden in the hopes to encourage more residents to spend time outside. Hale House will be renovating this area to include a memorial walkway, which will open up the opportunity for individuals to purchase an engraved brick. Harriet Hemenway who lived at 273 Clarendon Street back in 1890 was a founding member of the Audobon Society. Her home was the site of the first meeting. To honor the rich history and culture associated with Hale House, we plan to name this new garden area "Harriet's Hideaway". We have reached out to the Audobon Society who were pleased to hear this news and will be part of the dedication ceremony when the project is complete.

Hale House is currently in the design stages of this project but wanted to get the word out because we feel strongly that this new change will continue to reinforce our ongoing efforts to improve the quality of life each senior living at Hale House is afforded.

Renovations Continue on Exterior

Hale House has completed our most recent renovation project focused on the exterior of our historic building. This project was made possible by a grant from the Charles H. Farnsworth Trust, Bank of America, N.A., Trustee and other generous donations from individuals to Hale House

The restoration started in 2012 with the Clarendon Street facade. The latest portion included replacing 95 storm windows on the three remaining elevations of the building. This update impacted 30 residents rooms and several common areas including the living room, library, three sitting areas, the nursing area and the Admissions/Resident Services Coordinator's office.

These replacement windows will help promote energy efficiency while maintaining the rich history of our brownstone. Painting and masonry repairs were also completed during this time.

Hale House Partners with Schools in Community

Hale House is centered in a wonderful area of Boston. It is surrounded by rich culture and history in addition to many educational institutions. Hale House is often contacted by schools ranging from elementary through graduate programs. Every group that enters our home brings a unique experience for the individuals living here.

Hale House has developed a strong partnership with Northeastern University over the years and many of their different groups come to visit throughout the year. More recently, a variety of sports programs came out to expand the relationship even further. The

women's basketball and hockey teams (see pictures on right) were able to show off their skills and also provided Hale House with tickets to attend a game. Northeastern University has also been hosting an annual Halloween party for years. These events become tradition and something that the residents look forward to attending.

The Boston Conservatory has been running a class called "Movement Matters". They utilize music and dance to promote exercise. The residents really enjoyed the class and were excited to have it start again in September.

Boston University is another college that has reached out to us. The B.U. Medical School has a group of students that come through during their geriatric rotation. They are able to answers questions and also educate the residents on different topics. A sorority group hosted a BINGO event this past spring.

Emerson College students ran a creative writing project with the residents. In addition, a theater group was formed which resulted in a film being created by the residents. The film was shown to the community during a Hollywood event at Hale House. It was an opportunity for the group to share what they had created with their neighbors. The student has now graduated but continues to run the group as an alumni of Emerson.

The Berklee School of Music is another group that has forged a strong relationship within Hale House. For the last few years a group of students come weekly to run an interactive music group with the residents. This group serves as a practicum for the students and is a very engaging activity for the individuals living here. There is a large turnout all year long. We are pleased that they are able to come throughout the summer as well.

Hale Barnard's Bill Payer Program and Budget Management Program for Seniors currently manages the finances for over 125 low-income clients in the Greater Boston Area. These are vital services being offered to many at risk individuals who may otherwise find themselves being financially exploited or simply not budgeting their income and becoming at risk for homelessness.
